

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

- 1. Content was very good.
- 3. Participants felt that they learnt new terminologies, TL methods and assessment methods.
- Well –organised workshop.
- 5. Newer media was introduced to the participants.

### . b. Reaction -feedback analysis with diagrams (delete what is not relevant)

The feedback received from the participants revealed that they perceived the workshop to be well organized and very informative, They appreciated the workshop's interactive nature that ensured active participation. They mentioned that the activities and tasks given were the strengths of the workshop and said it was a detailed hands-on workshop. They felt that the workshop was very effective and content oriented and that the sessions would be very helpful for implementing in day to day practice and help them improve their teaching skills.
