

**8.1.4: Report on the steps taken by the college to attainment of specific clinical competencies in the stated undergraduate curriculum**

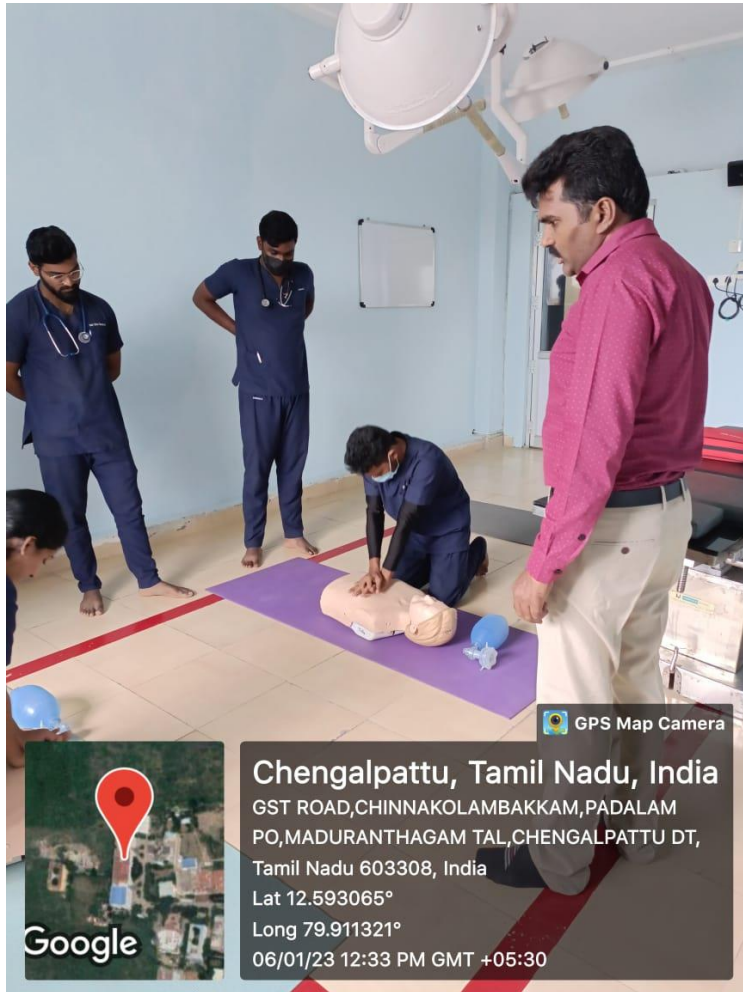
Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre adheres to the curriculum stated by the National Medical Council and The Tamil Nādu Dr MGR Medical University. All the pre and para clinical departments are using the OSPE and clinical departments are using OSCE for the attainment of the clinical skills. While knowledge is achieved by the didactic lectures, group discussions and seminars. Knowledge on recent advances is updated through the various CME's. The attitude and communications skills are accomplished through role play, small group discussions and value-added courses and AETCOM modules. Steps taken by the institute for attainment of the clinical competencies in the Interns:

1. Orientation program- highlights about ethics, communication skills and attitude.
2. BLS/ ACLS program: are useful in obtaining higher level of the skills. Students are exposed to the certain courses like Basic life support, Advanced cardiac life support, venipuncture etc.
3. Community Postings: Community oriented programs are conducted during the clinical posting in Community medicine. Rural postings: Students are posted in rural areas to understand problems in rural area and to learn preventive measures for the same.
4. Workshop: workshops are conducted to bestow hands on training.
5. Casualty Postings: All emergencies encountered during day to clinical settings are taught in casualty postings.
6. Daily morning clinical audit: CRRIs present the cases morning 8.30 -9.00 am which they have seen previous day during duty hours in front of the senior faculties.

At the end of their completion of postings CRRIs are evaluated for their knowledge, attitude and communication skills through OSCE. It is an excellent tool for assessing all the domains and competencies.

- You evaluate Mrs L S, 48 years old lady presented with lymphadenopathy. She had been complaining of fever, weight loss for past 5 months. On examination: large rubbery lymph node in axilla and groin, spleen palpable. Accompanied with her caring husband, Laxmi undergoes biopsy, pathologist calls you and informs it is lymphoma. Husband keeps report on your table.
- You noticed that final diagnosis has been altered to tuberculosis. When you look at husband, he tells "Doctor, I goggled lymphoma, which is cancer. My wife cannot handle this and she will be frightened, I want to tell my life that she had TB. She is waiting outside, I thought I will call her after chat with you.
